Scene from "Hearts of the World," the screen's greatest production, showing at the Majestic all this week at prices ranging from 25 cents to \$1.50. The story is remarkably free from the clap-trap and spread-eagleism that mar so many war pictures. Mr. Griffith evidently felt that his subject was too big for petty heroics, and he wisely selected to approach it in a simple manner. He has shown the tragedy of a French village, one unit in the world tragedy, overwhelmed by the German invasion. He follows the method that he used in his story of the American Civil War. Great panoramas of the war are shown that give an idea of the size of the catastrophe, and then the tragedy is epitomized in single incidents—the partings, the sufferings or the heroisms of the characters whose experiences form the thread of the plot. The story opens in the village shortly before the war. The love affair between the Boy and the Girl is unfolded, with tiffs and misunderstandings and moments of romance. Then on the day set for the wedding comes the call to arms. The Boy departs without any idea of the seriousness of the affair. The Germans arrive, and the defenders are thrown back. The French village falls into the hands of the invaders, who capture the Girl. She faces terrible experiences of slavery and worse, but is finally rescued by the Boy. Everything happens in and about the one French village.



ST. George's Chapel in London Reproduced for Clara Kimball Young. Clara Kimball Young's production of "The Reason Why" for Select Pictures is marked throughout by a gorgeousness of scene and sartorial investiture which make it especially noteworthy. It is fitting, therefore, that the wedding scene of the story, in which Miss Young, as Zara, marries Lord Tancred, a scion of the bluest blood in Britain, should be staged in a set whose lavishment stands out in even this production.
In Miss Young's studio was erected an exact replica of St. George's Chapel in Hanover Square, London, internationally famous as Hymen's rendezvous for Mayfair, the scene of the smartest weddings of England's proudest nobility. Ellnor Glyn, the author of the novel, "The Reason Why," is herself a member of the Mayfair set, and has been a guest at many of the elaborate functions held at St. George's. Her description of it embodies, therefore, the very spirit as well as the physical characteristics of the Chapel. Not trusting her own memory of the Chapel, Miss Young has insisted on a faithful adherence to this word-picture, as well as numerous authentic photographs, in the studio reproduction.
It was for "The Reason Why," incidentally, that Lucile, world-renowned dressmaker, created nineteen masterpieces to be worn by the beautiful star, giving an added personal attention to them, because she is Mrs. Glyn's sister. This picture will be shown at the Patricia Theatre today, Tuesday and Wednesday.

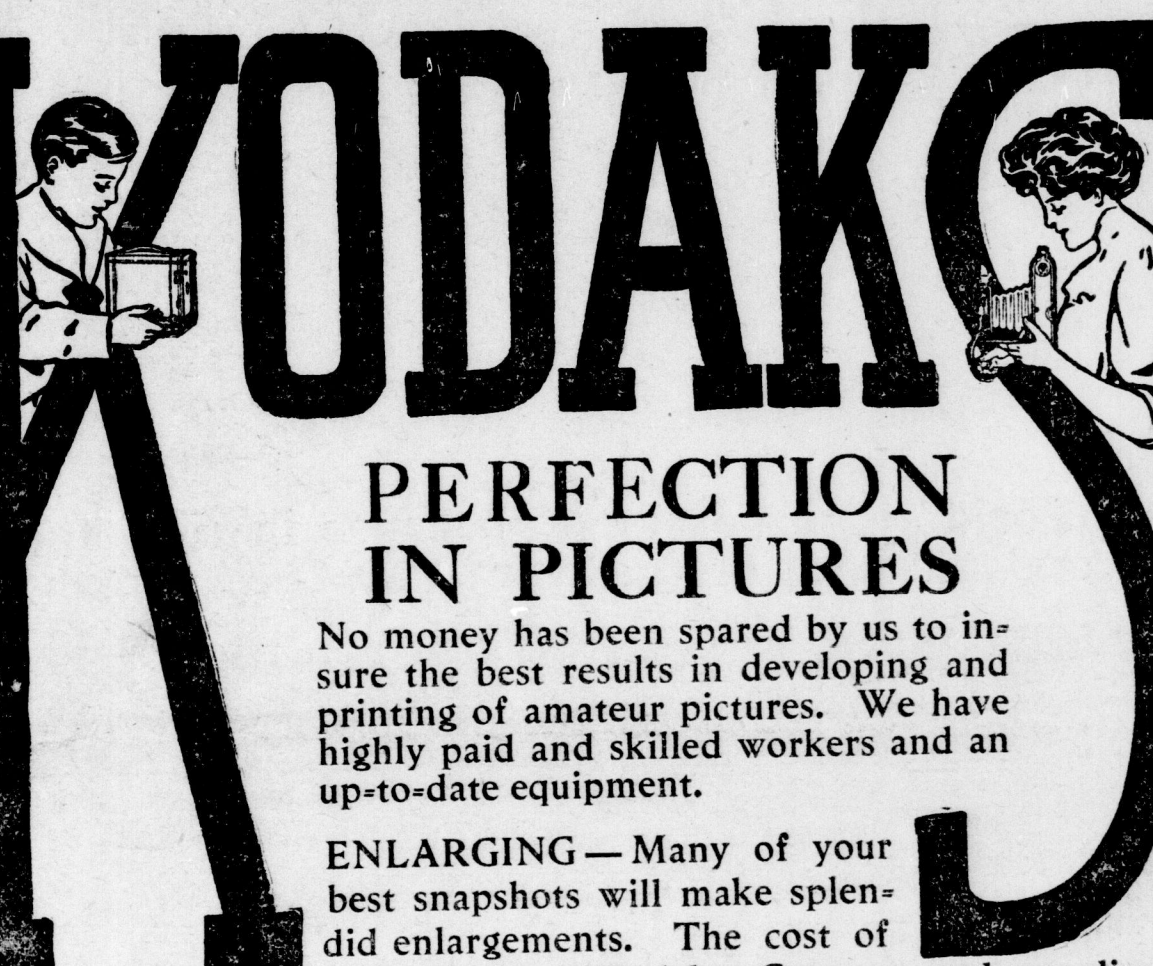

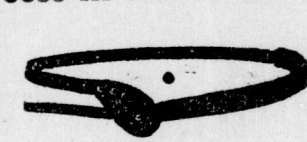
