The official statement announcing Erzberger's retirement from the cabinet bases his action on his desire to have an investigation concerning his income tax without reference to or in consideration of his official position.

The resignation was tendered to President Ebert, who ordered an investigation of the income tax incident conducted with all possible promptness.

He charged that Erzberger was the Brittsh propagands ministers' best ally. Helfferich also asserted that Erzberger's fortune was made during the war by utilization of his political and parliamentary position, and indicated various alleged incidents where Erzberger had secretly amassed large sums as a result of his governmental position. Erzberger denied all these allegations. He asserted that he was not possessed of a large fortune, but admitted that they contained 50 cases of whiskey.






