"STUNG" BY PROMOTER.
Western Ontario Men Stand to Lose
Thru Fraud.

ST. THOMAS, Sept. 15.—(Special).—A sensation has been caused by the disclosures resulting from the motion to wind up the London and Port Stanley Amusement Co.

Early in the year a young New Yorker, C. H. Oberhelde came here and promoted the company to take over the famous Fraser House at Port Stanley, to purchase additional land and install Coney Island attractions. Elaborate changes were made and the promoters

On a motion for a winding-up order the books were examined. There were no vouchers. Furnishings were entered in the books for hundreds of dollars over cost. About a thousand dol-

lars was paid for silverware and only a third received. The balance went to Chicago. There are many irregularities and the directorate are liable for the loss as a block of stock. Oberheide contracted to sell remains unsold. The deed of the house was not even transferred.

Prominent St. Thomas men are directors and all stand to lose.
