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Sir,

Referring to Official letter dated 11th

June 16st authorizing the sale of the then
unsold portion of Mill Site No 3 Sheguiandah
to the Municipality of Howland, for the sum of \$250.00 on the usual terms of sale.

I have the honor to report that the above property was sold to the Municipality of Howland on the 7th day of July 1902 under sale 3922, one fifth of the purchase money being paid at the date of sale.

I am now in receipt of an order, on the Treasurer of the Municipality of Howland, for \$206.00 which he states is to pay up for the above mentioned property.

As the conditions of sale were "one fifth at the time of sale and the balance in equal annual instalments with interest thereon at 6% per annum? the next payment of \$50.00 would not fall due until July 7 1903. As the property has been extensively improved, and is splendid security for the amount due the Department against it. I do not think it would be to the best interests of the Indians to allow the same to be paid out for at once, but would most respectfully recommend that the payments be
