IN reviewing the work of this Society for the past year, the Executive Committee feel gratified to believe that the efforts put forth in the cause of humanity, have been to a large extent successful.

The following statement will shew the number of prosecutions during the year :

A carter, beating his horse with whip handle, in Upper Town Market, fined \$1 and costs.

A carter, beating his horse with a stick, in Des Sœurs street, fined \$1 and costs.

Three persons, encouraging, aiding, and assisting cock-fighting, fined \$10 and costs each.

Three persons, encouraging, aiding, and assisting cock-fighting, fined \$5 and costs each.

A carter, driving a horse with a sore shoulder, in Des Sœurs street, fined \$2 and costs.

A labourer, kicking his horse, in Joseph street, fined \$5 and costs.

Four persons, each fined \$2 and costs, being present at a cock fight.

A farmer, beating his horse, on Beauport road, fined \$1 and costs.

A labourer, beating an ox on the head, fined \$1 and costs.

A carter, beating his horse, on Champlain Market, fined \$2 and costs.

A carter, driving his horse with a sore shoulder, fined \$1 and costs.

A drover, beating cows with a whip, fined \$2 and costs.
