In my Report at the Annual Session I mentioned that the National Division had imposed a tax for a propagation fund of ten cents on each member introduced within the jurisdiction during the year. No action was then taken thereon. It is now necessary that something should be done to meet this extra charge as the receipts of the Grand Division are at present barely sufficient to meet the Ordinary expenses.

I desire to urge upon you the necessity of devising means for the permanent employment of an agent, whose duty it shall be to visit our different Divisions, to strengthen and encourage them in their work, also to visit those localities where no temperance organization exists and endeavour to organize Divisions of the S. of T. This I believe to be the most efficient means to promote the growth and increase the vitality of our Order.

As directed by the Grand Division, I addressed each of the other Grand Divisions in the British Provinces in America, on the subject of a National Division for British North America, as also of an Inebriate Asylum. I submit the answers received.

I also beg to lay before you copies of a Statistical Report, submitted to the Conventions of the Canada Temperance Union, held in Toronto in September last.
