London, May 9.—The body of the dead king reclines under an ordinary cover and a few white flowers and violets, placed by Queen Alexandra, on a low single wooden bed, which stands in the middle of the room where the sunshine falls upon it. The king died at the head of his bed near a window so that he could get the outlook over Constitution Hill. His hands lie in a natural position and still wear his ring.
