POUND'S RISE FAILS TO ROUSE N. Y. MARKET

Trading Drifts Within Narrow Limits On Wall Street

VALUES IRREGULAR ON MONTREAL EXCHANGE

Several Losses and Gains Reported at Canadian Financial Centre This Morning

NEW YORK, May 15.—(Opening)—Return of sterling exchange to gold parity failed to arouse much enthusiasm in the stock market, which continued to drift within rather narrow and irregular limits at the opening of trading today. Auctioneers advanced 1/8, and General Motors seven-eighths. Hudson Motors dropped over two points to a new low for the year at 40, and Weyerhaeuser dropped one to a new low at 19.

MONTREAL, May 15.—Trading on the local stock exchange at the opening this morning was fairly active and well distributed in a wide range of issues. Values were irregular and several losses and gains were recorded. Brazilian, the leader, opened at 96 for a gain of three-eighths point, subsequently sold at 95 1/2, and reacted around 10.00 to 95 1/2 for a net gain of one-eighth. Smelters were particularly inactive, opening at 10 1/2 for a gain of a half point. Lyall at 41 was up one point, Woods Manufacturing lost two points at 45. Brewster gained a half at 94 1/2, and Cement lost a fraction at 94. On a three share transaction the Bank of Commerce, ex-dividend, sold down three points at 217.

NEW YORK, May 15.—There is no change in the character of the market. Motors were heavy on the G.M.O. extra dividend, but the selling did not attract a great deal of attention and the bears did not make much headway. At the same time there was good buying of some of the oils, notably Marland. We look for further selling movements in the leading industrials, but do not think they will make a great deal of headway. A sagging market rather than a break in the market is most likely. At the same time oils look higher, principally M.O., H.O., P.M., J. and S.Y.E. and the good rails should be good for long pull speculations at this level.

POUND EVEN FIRST TIME SINCE 1914

Return of Sterling to Gold Parity So Soon Comes as a Surprise

NEW YORK, May 15.—Sterling exchange sold at gold parity—148—in the New York market today for the first time since 1914. Cables on London were quoted here at 4.84 1/2, soon after the opening, that figure previously having been reached in the London market. While the return of sterling to parity was regarded as only a question of time when Great Britain returned to the gold standard last year, the sudden attainment of the goal came somewhat as a surprise to local dealers in foreign exchange. In some quarters the rise in sterling was regarded as an indication of a heavy transfer of funds from Italy, France, Belgium and other countries which had depreciated currencies to England and the United States, where the gold standard is effective. In other quarters the buying was attributed to British Government sources as part of a plan to attract gold to that country. French francs sank to a new low here at 2.01 1/2 cents, and Belgian francs were about four points lower, around 2.01 cents, but Italian lire rallied several points to 4.45 cents.
