



THE TURF New Records

New Records

Kalamazoo, Mich., Aug. 12—Two world's records were broken today by Peter Volo, driven by Tom Murphy, in winning the Horseman and Spirit of the Times futurity for three year old trotters at the Grand Circuit meet here. His time of 2.04¾, 2.05¾ and 2.06¾ make them the three fastest heats ever trotted by a stallion, the former record being 2.07½, 2.08 and 2.02 made in 1910 by The Harvester.

The heats were also the three fastest by a three year old trotter, the honor having previously been held by Lucile Spier, which went them in 2.07¾. 2.07½ and 2.11 at Grand Rapids last week.

Tommy Murphy announced the purchase of the trotter Peter Scott, by Peter the Great, from Sanford Small of Boston. The price given was \$20,000.


