A- That's right, sir.

Q-103 Now did you recognize the accused when he was returned to A-19?

A- I recognized his face, sir, but I would not have placed him out on the street.

Q-104 You probably would not have remembered his name or anything but you might have remembered seeing his face in your training company?

A- That's right, sir.

Q-105 But to identify him positively you would not want to take your oath on it that it was Fuller when you first saw him until someone told you?

A- That's right, sir, I couldn't place his name but I did recognize the face.

Q-106 Probably a couple of years from now you might recognize my face but you won't know my name?

A- Yes, sir.

----- The Prosecutor declines to cross-examine.

BY THE JUDGE ADVOCATE:

Q-107 You remember the accused you say?

A- Yes, sir.

Q-108 Did the accused ever report to you? Were you his N.C.O. in charge there?

A- No I wasn't, sir. I remember his face but I don't remember anything about the man really when he was in the company.

----- In the opinion of the Court and Judge Advocate it is not necessary to comply with R.P. 83 (B).
