Entry by proxy may, however, be made at any Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader. DUTIES.--(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.
