No Candidate shall be admitted to the MATRICULATION EXAMINATION unless he have produced a Certificate* showing that he has completed his Sixteenth year, and a Certificate of Good Conduct. These Certificates shall be transmitted to the Registrar at least one calendar month before the commencement of the Examination.

A Fee of Two Dollars shall be paid at Matriculation. No Candidate shall be admitted to the Examination unless he have previously paid this Fee to the Registrar. If, after payment of his Fee, a Caudidale withdraws his name, or fails to present bimself at the Examination, or fails to pass it, the lee shall not be returned to him; but be shall be allowed to eater for any two subsequent MATRICULATION Examinations without the parment of any additional Fee, provided that he give notice to the Registear at less fourteen days before the cor percement of the Examination; such notice, in respect to the privilege aforesaid, being considered equivalent to entry.

The Examination shall be conducted by means of Written or Printed Papers; but the Examiners shall not be precluded from putting, for the purpose of ascertaining the competence of the Caroidales io pass, vive woce questions to any Candidate in the subjects in which they are appointed to examine.

Two Latin subjects to be selected by the Senate not less than two

OvidOne Book of the Meiamorphoses. Virgil One Boo's of the Eacid.

Cicero One of the four Catilinarian Orations.

Simple and easy sentences of English to be translated into Latin, (Text-Book suggested §: Smith's Principia Latina, Part I.) Questions will be set in History and Geography, arising out of the Books prescribed.
