We have much pleasure in presenting our seventh annual report, and although our membership is smaller than in previous years, we trust the meetings have been profitable to those who have attended.

Our membership roll at the end of the year is 20 active and 10 associate.

Two union meetings have been held with the Westmount Methodist Society, and one in January last with the Endeavor societies of the West end.

Last spring, our Society gave an evening's entertainment to the old people of the "Old Folks' Home" at Longue Pointe, which we trust was enjoyable to all.

The Social Committee has continued the work of placing flowers in the Church each Sunday, and afterwards taking them to the sick of the Congregation.

The Missionary and Charitable Committee has started the work of filling a box for a mission in the North-West, and has also sent a box of literature to a mission in Newfoundland.

Early in the year, our Society promised Dr. Robertson \$25.00 to help build a school-house in the North-West, part of which was raised at a lecture on "Scottish Life and Character," kindly given by Prof. Ross. We have also given \$8.65 to City Missions, and \$14.80 to Foreign Missions.
