Austro-German Forces Occupy Gorizia and Town of Cividale, Five Miles Within Italian Territory.

London, Oct. 28.—The Austro-German armies under the command of Emperor Charles, who has as his chief assistant Field Marshal von Mackensen, are shaking the entire Italian line from the Julian Alps region to the Adriatic Sea.
