QUEEN'S BENCH-IN APPEAL.

An application was made to the Court in the course of the present term, in the case of Wurtele, appellant, and His Lordship the Bishop of Quebec, respondent, that the appeal be dismissed, on the ground of the judgment of the Superior Court at Quebec, refusing the rule for a mandamus, not being on the merits but a refusal of the Court to entertain the matter at all. The Court in pronouncing judgment this morning, to the effect that the respondent should take nothing by his motion-declared that the Court below had, by the motive of its judgment, entered into the merits of the application made to it for a mandamus, by adjudicating that the respondent was not bound to comply with the request of the appellant as would have been done by the Inferior Tribunal in dealing with a return to the rule for a mandamus. The matter will therefore come fully before the Court of Appeals. By the 20th section of the 12th Victoria, cap. 41, it is enacted, that an appeal shall lie to the Court of Queen's Bench, sitting in appeal, from all final judgments rendered by the Superior Court in all cases provided by that act, except in cases of certiorari.—Quebec Mercury, of the 17th Jan.

DIOCESE OF MONTREAL.

VISITATION OF THE LORD BISHOP.
On Wednesday, 21st January, the Lord Bishop of Montreal held his primary Visitation in the Cathedral Church of that city. Divine Service commenced at half past ten, A. M., with the Litany, which was said by the Rev. Dr. Adamson, after which an Anthem, taken from the 86th Psalm, was sung, and a Sermon was preached by the Rev. Dr. Bethune from St. John xvii, 21. The names of the Clergy having been called over, his Lordship delivered his charge, which has since been published at the request of the Clergy. The Holy Communion was then administered.

In the evening a preliminary meeting of the Clergy and Lay Representatives, was held at the National School

House, the Lord Bishop occupying the chair.

After prayer by his Lordship, on motion of the Rev. Mr. Bond, seconded by the Rev. Mr. Armstrong, the Rev. Charles Bancroft, A. M., was requested to act as Clerical Secretary; and, on motion of the Rev. Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Rev. Mr. Whitwell, G. Pyke, Esq., was appointed Lay Secretary.

The Clerical Secretary, by the desire of the Bishop, called over the names of the Clergy, who gave in those of the Lay Delegates from their respective congregations.
