

(4.) That you have not, directly or indirectly, paid or promised anything to any person either to induce him to vote or to refrain from voting at this election.

(5.) That you are not otherwise disqualified from voting at this election. So help you God.

*V.—(Section 74.)

Oath of identity by voter receiving a ballot paper, after another has voted in his name.

You swear (or solemnly affirm) that you are A. B., of (as on the list of voters) whose name is entered on the list of voters now shown you. So help you God.

W.—(Section 75.)

Oath of voter unable to mark his ballot paper.

You swear (or solemnly affirm) that you are unable to read and to understand the ballot paper so as to mark it, (or that you are incapacitated by blindness or other physical cause, as the case may be) from voting without assistance. So help you God.

X.—(Section 83)

Oath of the deputy returning officer after the closing of the poll.

I, the undersigned, deputy returning officer for the polling district No. of the electoral district of swear (or solemnly affirm) that, to the best of my knowledge and belief, the poll-book kept for the said polling district, under my direction, hath been so kept correctly, that the total number of votes polled in the said poll-book is , and that it contains a true and exact record of the votes given at the polling station in the said polling district, as the said votes were taken thereat; that I have faithfully counted the votes given for each candidate, in the manner by law provided, and performed all duties required of me by law, and that the report, poll-book, packets of ballot papers, and other documents required by law to be returned by me to the returning officer, have been faithfully and truly prepared and placed within the ballot box, as this oath (or affirmation) will be, to the end that
