## Special Meeting To Discuss Subsidized Housing June 29

A special meeting of the Park Royal Community Association will be held at the Community Centre next Tuesday, June 29, to air the pros and cons of a proposed subsidized housing plan in the south end of Park Royal.

It has been made known that the Ontario Housing Corporation proposes to buy 55 homes in the Brookhust, Nigel Rd., Wiseman and Bray Court sector to rent to families who have applied for subsidized housing.

A wave of protest came from a number of Park Royal residents who expressed fears that such a move would result in the whole sub-division gradually turning into a rental district.

There is wide-spread con-

cern among Park Royal home-owners that their property values will drop if this proposal goes through. Some fear that the equity they now have in their properties could be completely wiped out by such a move. An example of the concern which these people have for this matter was shown when approximately 350 turned out for a Sunday "emergency meeting" on only an hour's notice to receive word of this plan.

The Community Association has called a general meeting for next Tuesday and some members of council will definitely be in attendance at that time to take part in the discussion. Representatives of United Lands Corporation and the Ontario Housing Corporation will also attend this meeting.

### PUBLIC NOTICE

Take Notice that

(1) The Council of the Corporation of the Township of Toronto intends to construct a 16" watermain on Mississauga Road from Dundas Street West to Rogers Road, a distance of 6,500 feet more or less at an estimated cost of \$104,800.00. Part of the cost will be assessed against land abutting the work and the remainder will be assessed against the Township of Toronto Water Area.

(2) The total estimated cost of the work is \$104,800.00 of which the Township of Toronto Water Areas share is \$75,390.40. The owners' share is \$29,409.60. The estimated cost per foot frontage is \$2.40. The annual payments per foot frontage will be \$0.20923. The special assessment is to be paid in twenty (20) annual instalments. The estimated lifetime of the work is 31 years.

(3) Application will be made by the Corporation to the Ontario Municipal Board for its approval of the undertaking of the work and any owner may, within twenty-one (21) days after the first publication of this notice, file with the Clerk his objection to the work being undertaken.

(4) The Board may approve of the work being undertaken, but before doing so, it may appoint a time and place when any objections to the work will be considered.
