Dear Sir-

In reply to your letter of the 7th Instant respecting the Reserves set apart for the Indians of the County of Pictou, N.S., and asking for a description of these lands, I beg to inform you that Reserve No 24, containing 50 acres, is situated at the head of Moodie Cove, on the South side of the entrance to Pictou Harbour.

Reserve No 24A is situated at Boat Harbour. It was purchased by the Dominion Government on the 7th of December 1874. This Reserve then contained 80 acres, but 16 acres were cut off and given in exchange for No 24B.

Reserve 24B lies between and adjoins No 24 and 24A and it contains 11 acres, received in exchange for the 16 acres cut off 24A.

Reserve 24C is situated East of and adjoining 24A. It contains 30 acres and was purchased by
