We Loved forundawana as our Own brother, when I the Governoise firsts heard of his Lofs I dent a Letter Immediatly to the Indians of fanes logoe to Lett them Senow that If they would lend and see if he was yet alive and fould be Pudumed, I would Lend and see if he was yet alive and fould be Indumed, Jwould Lay his Chansome. We send a thore to for the allamy's Son

As Joon as you de and hear this Letter; Wedesire you Our good Friends to goe dore city to the Five Nation's "the Ten Norde herewith delivered to you, and Preventing them, to their Chiefs in the name of John Lenn who was born in this Country to his Father William Lenn their brother when he Was last bear, and also in my name, Tell them that we Mourn in the deepest of our Hearts for their Lofs, and that we Send these Tronds to four their dead. We grieve when they Loose any of their Geople, we would have their Numbers In ore ase, that they May be a great Leople, and we Mourn when they are Leften's or when they Destroy themselves by War

We are much Troubled that they wend to Fights to Indiana that wow in Friendship with the English, and were Tradeing to them, The English would not hurt the Five Nations Ithey them, but they thought them Enemies, because they Game to Fight against their Friends, all the English are one Deople, and all their Friends Should be one Deople, we grieve for this Mistake and unhappy Lofs

Tell them we expect John Denn over here next Spring, and he will devore to Freate with them, when he former we Shall dend to them, We have wis hed to Speak with them Since Connofsoora Sannewhannegahs and their formpany were here about three years Since when John Denn Treaks with them We Shall then all open our breasts, wery one will then speak
