to England, that New York capital could not be incorporated in their association. Of course, those Toronto capitalists were mostly men connected with the movement against reciprocity. As you know, they are pushing very far their ideals in that respect. I think, however, that they must have realized, since the war has started, that we are not as independent as they thought of American influence and Amirican financial interests.

I think that my son-in-law, with the experience he acquired in the formation of the Canada Bond Corporation, could do something which would be useful to the development of that association. With the hope that I am not trespassing on your kindness, I take the liberty of bringing those facts to your consideration in the hope that you may perhaps feel disposed to say a good word to Mr. Rockefeller in favour of my son-in-law.
