Dear Mr. King:

I am giving myself the pleasure of sending you, under separate cover, a few of my little papers in which occur certain ideas and formulations of ideals which I am sure will interest you. Our conversation last week gave me very great satisfaction, and I wish again to express my pleasure in meeting you. The article to which I referred is in press. I shall send you one when it appears, with certain other materials that seem to be more or less closely related to your special interests and problems.

I learned last evening that "Whither" was originally published in the Atlantic Monthly and then reprinted by Houghton and Mifflin. I have not yet had opportunity to read it, but I promise you that I shall shortly.

My visit to Canada was most fruitful, for I came home loaded with ammunition which could immediately be used on official Washington. To-day I leave for the Capitol for conference concerning profitable relations of psychology to military affairs. I hope and believe that something may be accomplished now because of the crisis which will lead to developments of farreaching ^{social} and
