as between Canada and Britain, would be the most important of all the matters likely to come up for consideration and discussion. It was the resegnition of the importance of the British market for Canadian wheat which, so far as Canada is concerned, gave to the Imperial Economic Conference of 1930 its real significance.

Up to this point I think it may be said that, with the exceptions as mentioned, there was in the main pretty general agreement.

The difference arose over the question of method - the method by which the objective, held in common, was to be achieved; difference in the methods to be employed to gain the market in Britain for Canadian wheat.
