

5. Mr. Duff's motion re reduction of duties on
implements of production in the fishing industry:

"That in the opinion of this House the best interests of Canada demand that the burden of customs taxation be lessened on the instruments of production in the fishing industry and to this end all articles required in the said industry should be free from customs duties."

At the request of the Minister of Finance, this Resolution also was not proceeded with.

6. Inquiries by Right Honourable Mr. King as to the
state of negotiations:

At numerous stages during the session, Mr. King inquired as to the progress of negotiations and was merely told that they were continuing. On the last day of the session, July 5, 1935, he was told by the Prime Minister that negotiations had not reached a stage which would justify a statement being made to the House.
