Mr. S. Leduc is the interpreter at La' appelle and was paid his wages for August, September, October and November.

Mr. Mr. Donald states in his official report on the payments that he left La' appelle on the evening of the 12th Sept for Fishing Lake. He must therefore have taken William Joseph with him to act as interpreter and servant, but Joseph's pay commenced on the 8th August according to books \$4.25, and it would therefore appear that he was paid as interpreter for annuity payments during a period of 19 days (between 8th Augth and 18th Sept) when he was not on that service, and that the regular interpreter
