Sir:-

In further reference to the Department's letter of January 16th, conveying approval of the Crown Attorney taking charge of the appealed case of Mr. M. J. Caughan against your conviction for the sale of liquor to an Indian named William Arquette, I beg to say that it appears advisable to move to set aside the order for a writ of certiorari in view of the words of the Statute:- "No such conviction shall be \*\*\* removed by certiorari into any superior court."

Be kind enough therefore to bring this matter to the attention of the Crown Attorney and advise the Department that you have done so, reporting at the same time the result of your interview with him.
