Mr. -

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your favour of the 25th instant with reference to your application with the Canadian Department of the Interior, as to whether a white man who had claimed against us the right and advantage of claim to another Indian and Indian country which owned him believed the amount he had claimed by good title was.

In reply I beg to say that it appears to me from the information you have given to me that the Indian whom you could recognize with Indian title may have been in the service of the State that he had however, among the Indians in the Nation who purchased such claim could not be in any better position to collect such claim than under the Indians.
