Sir,-

With reference to a recent letter which you wrote the Department in which you stated that cattle belonging to the Industrial Indian School at Lytton have been stolen and that the Provincial police have failed to discover the thieves or to prevent in any way such depredations, I beg to say that the Department is writing to the Hon. H. F. Young, Provincial Secretary for the Province, in this matter. I may also add that it is proposed to appoint at an early date a Provincial constable whose headquarters will be at Lytton and whose services will be available in cases such as referred to. The appointment will be made as soon as Parliament votes the money for the constable's salary and the same is made available.
