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Ottawa, 13th June, 1913.

Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 10th instant, regarding the case of two tubercular Indian patients, and in reply I beg to say that the Department approves of the doctor sending the girl to Toronto, in order that she may be treated in the Hospital. The Department will pay at the usual rates for her maintenance. You may arrange to have her sent to the hospital under the care of a reliable person. No unnecessary expense ~~will~~^{should} be incurred. Be good enough to forward a report from the doctor in this case. The report should have accompanied your letter, above quoted. It should state the name, and age of the girl, and give the band to which she belongs, in order that it may be ascertained whether she draws interest or annuity money.

Accounts for expenses in the case of the woman who is ill may be submitted.
