

Q.40 For his duties?
A.40 Yes.

CROSS-EXAMINED BY THE DEFENDING COUNSEL

Q.41 Major Corkum, you stated in your evidence that the accused's duty was distinctly in connection with rationing. Is that correct?

A.41 Yes.

Q.42 Was he called upon at anytime to perform other than those connected with rationing?

A.42 Yes, with those connected with Quartermaster.

Q.43 Did the duties of the accused on occasion call for him to proceed outside the Camp area?

A.43 I cannot say they did, but they conceivably might.

Q.44 Was the majority of evidence taken did you state that was for the case?

A.44 I stated, "that they might", as some matter here.

Q.45 Then to your knowledge it could be that the accused was called outside the Camp area in performance of his duty?

A.45 Yes.

Q.46 When a driver left the Camp area was it necessary for that driver to procure a "pass"?

A.46 I believe so, yes.

Q.47 Do you know whether or not such a pass was issued?

A.47 No, I don't know.

Q.48 Would it be that this pass could be issued without a driver?

A.48 Yes.

Q.49 What type of pass was issued to Sergeant Lister to operate the vehicle and to proceed outside the Camp?
