

members of the Ahousat Band, if available, in connection with the said operations and shall provide all transportation necessary to take such Indian employees to and from the scene of the said operations and shall pay them at the prevailing rates of wages.

4. Advance shall conduct its operations in a good workmanlike and efficient manner so as to produce the best possible grade and scale and shall take all precautions to prevent the starting or spreading of fires and shall comply with all regulations made by the Department of Forestry and use all other statutes and orders made by competent authority in connection with the cutting, felling and removing of timber and trees and will not permit any Woodsmen's Liens or other liens to be filed against the said timber and shall pay all assessments usually levied against an employer including but not limited to Unemployment Insurance and Workmen's Compensation.

5. Advance shall pay the Owners for the said timber and trees cut and removed by it as follows:- fifty (50%) per cent of the profit made by Advance on the sale of such timber and trees without any deductions whatsoever for Income Tax. The said profit shall be determined by competent auditors employed by Advance and at the expense of Advance and all such statements and books of account shall be open to inspection by the Indian Department or any auditor employed by it.

6. All logs shall be scaled before rafting and payments from time to time on account of the aforesaid sum payable to the Owners shall be made at the rate of \$ 5.00 per M, B. C. Log Scale within ten (10) days after receipt of Government scale sheets in respect of each raft. The final payment on the total amount found
