WILL THE SAFETY BE SUPPLANT-

A Unicycle Which the Inventor Claims Can Beat All Wheel Records.

A novelty in the cycling line which has been attracting considerable attention for some time past is a unicycle most ingenious ly contrived to run along by its own momentum after it has been fairly set going by the usual pedalling method. A forward inclination of the rider's body keeps the wheel revolving, and it is said it can be easily stopped by leaning backward. The same simple law of gravitation causes to spin unerringly round any curve towar which the rider leans on either side.

The machine has no steering gear and is said to require none beyond the tendency given to its direction by the poise of the rider's body. The motion is generated as much ground at each revolution as would enable an average rider to compass a mile
