Mr. Blair, Sitting Member for the County of Cumberland, requesting permission to relign his Seat at the end of the present Session; and he read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered it in at the Cerk's Table, where it was read, and is as follows:

That the Committee have duly considered the Letter to them referred—That they find, on examining the Proceedings of the House of Commons, no precedent of any Member having resigned his Seat, but, on the contrary, so far back as 1623, an agreement "that after he is chosen he cannot relinquish." The cases are fully detailed in second Hatsel; but many where they have, on the the acceptance of certain situations, vacated their seats. That the Committee sind a precedent on our own Journals of a Member having been allowed to resign from continued ill health; and a request, similar to the one in question, whereon the House decided unfavorably; and thereupon,

Mr. Uniacke moved that the House do come to a Resolution as followeth, viz.

Resolved, That the Seat of Richard Blair, Esq. Member for the County of Cumberland, be declared vacant; and that Mr. Speaker be directed, on the proregation of the House, to apply in the usual manner for the issue of a new Writ: which being seconded and put, and the House dividing thereon, there appeared, for the motion, Three; against it, Twenty-five:
