MERRY DEL VAL MAY BE THE NEXT PONTIFF

The principal one to be affected by the proposed changes is the papal secretary of state, Cardinal Merry del Val, who will be transferred to the office of papal vicar-general...

From a high church dignitary it is also learned that Cardinal Rampold has been induced to give way to the plan may be furthered. The cardinal will be 64 years old next month and it is said that he welcomes a relief from arduous duties. The transfer to the archbishopric of Bologna, successor of the late Cardinal Svampa, is neither a promotion nor a reduction. The one question in ecclesiastical circles in Rome today is: "Who is to succeed Cardinal Merry del Val as papal secretary of state?"
