

Senate Gives Bill Third Reading - Clocks to be Changed on April 14th.

Ottawa, April 12.—The Daylight saving bill, which was put through the committee stage and given third reading in the Senate yesterday, will in all probability come into effect at 2 o'clock on Sunday morning, April 14th. A semi-official intimation to this effect was given by Senator Roertbson, Minister without portfolio, when the bill was being considered. Senator Rosertson gave as the reason for the bill becoming effective on Sunday morning, instead of on Sunday at midnight, the circumstance that fewer trains ran on Sundays. He said that less inconvenience would be caused by advancing the clocks sixty minutes at that hour in the morning, because late trains would have arrived at their destinations and morning their destinations and morning trains would be made up at a later

Senator Robertson's idea received the approval of Senator George Bradbury, who expressed the view that the change could be made with the least inconvenience at the hour suggested by the Minister.
