

TORONTO OF OLD.

The Plays That Entertained City In Its Young Days.
The death in London, Ont., of Mr. A. D. Holman, is a reminder to old-time Toronto folk of the "palm days" of the Holman Opera Co. One of these old-timers has been speaking to the Toronto News of the plays and the artists that brightened the grey life of Toronto from 1887 to 1891. It was the father of the late Mr. "Alfie" D. Holman who directed the fortunes of the Royal Lyceum Theatre, which was situated in the rear of Mr. Lyonde's photograph gallery, on King street. Mr. George Holman was counted a genius in stage management and in the details of "production."
His brother, Mr. Alfred, was the treasurer, but George supervised everything outside the box office. Among the members of the company were Mr. W. H. Crane, so favorably known in the modern theatre, and Signor Pergini, the famous tenor, who in those days warbled under the less imposing name of Jack Chatterley. The soprano and the prima donna were respectively Julia and Sally Holman, daughters of the director. Mr. Crane said on a recent visit to Toronto that he had never seen a more versatile young woman than Sallie. She was winsome and distinctive, appearing to advantage in grand opera, in comic opera, in tragedy, comedy and in farce.
When Mme. Tosti and her company gave "La Grande Duchesse" (Offenbach) in the old Music Hall, now the Public Library Branch on Church street, Mr. Holman closed his house and took the whole company to see the new opera. Two weeks afterwards he gave a production of the work in English, which was most creditable, perhaps more creditable touch upon the infatuation of the gilded youth of that period for Sallie and Julia. "Do you remember Fred?" Mr. Crane was asked recently. "Remember him?" responded "Billy." "I wanted to kill him. I liked the girl myself." Another distinguished citizen of to-day telegraphed his father from the confines of Upper Canada College that if he could not marry Julia, he would die. The answer was laconic: "Die!" The young man thought better of it and became a lawyer. Sallie, like most players, married in the profession, and her husband of protest must have arisen from a flock of collegians.
It is said that Mr. A. D. Holman was the last survivor of this distinguished and artistic family.

Cannibals In Canada.

The terrible conditions that exist along the eastern shores of the Hudson Bay, where hundreds of Eskimo have starved to death in recent years, were described in a moving speech delivered recently at the Anglican Synod by Rev. W. G. Walton, a missionary from that district in the Far North of Canada. The problem was due to a peculiar change in the food supply of that part of the Dominion. Years ago great herds of barren waste caribou lived in that part of Canada, and the Eskimo killed them for food. The caribou travelled farther south at certain seasons, and about 35 years ago they ceased to return to the shores of Hudson Bay. Some men thought this was due to a number of big bush fires that drove them to the east, but the explanation could not be given with any certainty. When the caribou failed to appear, the Eskimo were deprived of their great source of food. "Seals are scarce there," said Mr. Walton, "and I have travelled sometimes 400 miles along the coast without seeing one." The aborigines had no means of sustenance, and a result was a desperate situation. Mr. Walton told of one or two cases that illustrated how badly they were needed. In one instance an Eskimo woman ate her two half-grown daughters, and then died of starvation herself.
