DIAMOND JUBILEE DAY

Will be June 21, as Decided by the Imperial Government.

Ottawa, March 12.—(Special.)—The Government has advised that the Majesty's Government will select Tuesday, June 21, as the day on which to hold the official celebration of the Diamond Jubilee, and the Ministers are consequently considering whether it is advisable to observe that day for official celebration in the Dominion.

Special Issue of 3-cent Stamp.

Ottawa, March 14.—(Special.)—Here is good news for postage stamp collectors. The Postmaster-General has announced, as far as his department is concerned, to commemorate Her Majesty's Diamond Jubilee by the issue of a 3-cent postage stamp, appropriate to the occasion. It will have a limited circulation only, probably for a period of months covering the jubilee celebration during the coming summer.

The Philippine Islands.

Madrid, March 10.—A despatch from Manila, the capital of the Philippine Islands, to the Imperial, says that the situation there is very unsatisfactory, and that it will be necessary for Spain to occupy the entire island in order to completely crush the rebellion. The rebels are being driven back and more vigorous in their action, and the approaching rainy season will further hamper the operations of troops.
