GALLED ON CHRISTMAS

Hon. Raymond Prefontaine Dies Suddenly at Paris.

Angina Pectoris Caused Death Canadian Minister of Marine and Fisheries-Body Will Be Brought to Montreal, Que,-Sketch of His Life Shows He Entered National Politics as Member of Hochelaga County.

Paris, Dec. 26.-Hon. Raymond Prentaine. Canadian Minister of Marine and Fisheries, died suddenly at 9 o'clock last night. The cause of his death was angina pectoris.

death was angina pectoris.

Mr. Prefontaine, accompanied by
Randolph Lemieux, the Canadian Solicitor-General, came to France a couple of weeks ago from London, in con-nection, it is said, with the establish-ment of a line of steamers between Marsellles and Canadian ports. Soon after his arrival in Paris, the Minister complained that he was suf-

fering from heart trouble, but he con-tinued to fill his engagements.

During the progress of a banquet given in his honor Dec. 21, he was seen to be suffering acutely, but this at the time was attributed to emotion while replying to a toast to his health. The Minister on Saturday visited Lille and Dunkirk, but on returning to the Hotel Continental here, he was compelled to take his bed, and a phy-

sician was sent for. The latter pro-nounced Mr. Prefontaine's illness to be serious, and a specialist was called into consultation. Complete rest was advised, and all engagements were At 9 o'clock last night the adminisration of medicine was followed by a hoking sensation. The last sacra-nents were administered and death

ollowed immediately.
The British Minister, Sir Francis Bertie, was notified by Minister Lemieux, and arrangements for the funeral of the Minister were at once begun. The body will be taken to Montreal, Que, for interment.

Hon. Mr. Prefontaine came here from London, where he was negotiating with the Imperial authorities concerning the establishment of a naval militia in Canada, a subject in which he was deeply interested. A few days ago he was quoted as saying that the change in Government in Britain had delayed his plans, but that he was assured that the new Government was quite sympa-thetic with his designs. Sketch of His Life.

The Hon. Joseph Raymond Fourier Prefontaine has long been an active figure in municipal, provincial and fedngure in municipal, provincial and federal politics. He was born at Longueuil, Chambly, County of Quebec, Sept. 16, 1859. His family was of ancient descent, his ancestors having made their home in what was then New France in 1680. He was educated privately at St. Mary's College, Montwhere he took the degree of B. C. L. in 1873. In the same year he was call-ed to the bar, where his rise was rapid. M. Prefontaine possessed unusual abil-ity and forensic skill, and his firm of Prefontaine, Archer and Perron enjoy-ed one of the largest practices in Montreal. In 1893 he was created Queen's counsel.

First Sat For Chambly.

First Sat For Chambly.

In 1875 he made his first appearance as Liberal candidate for the Quebec Legislature in his native district of Chambly, and, in spite of considerable odds, was successful. In the Legislature he made his mark, but on offering himself for re-election in 1878, was defeated. His opponent, however, was unseated. In 1879 M. Prefontaine was again successful but was accessed. unseated. In 1879 M. Prefontaine was again successful, but was again defeated in 1881. During the period he interested himself in municipal life, and in 1879 was elected a councillor of Hochelaga, at that time the principal east end suburit of Montreal. His policy in municipal affairs was progressive, and he worked strenuously on behalf of the citizens. He supported the annexation of that town to the City of Montreal, and the union was completed in 1884. For some years he fore he had acted as mayor of Hochelaga, and was returned to the ward as alderman to the City Council. He sat continuously until 1888, when he was elected mayor by acclamation, re-elected in 1906 by a large majority. He withdrew voluntarily in 1902, although nominated for re-election. He also acted on the Board of School Commissioners, to which he was elected in

In National Politics.

M. Prefontaine's appearance in the field of national politics was made under circumstances of peculiar interest. After the Northwest Rebellion, an election occurred in Hochelaga County, which had been arranged by the late Sir John A. Macdoned, apparently to test the strength of the parties. The Liberal candidate was M. Prefontaine, and the election became of national importance. He won a decisive victory, He was re-elected in 1887 and importance. He won a decisive vic-tory, He was re-elected in 1887 and 1890, and, in 1896, became first mem-ber for the new constituency of Mais-onneuve by a majority of 1,570, which was increased in 1900 to 1,774. Cabinet Meeting Called.

Ottawa, Dec. 26.—The news of the death of Hon. Mr. Prefontaine came as a painful shock. The first official notification was a cable received by Sir Wilfrid Laurier about 8 o'clock. It was from Hon. Rudolph Lemieux, but contained nothing but the bare announcement of the death and said details would be forwarded later. Up to a late hour last night no additional information had been received.

On receipt of the cable the Prime Minister immediately notified the var-

Minister immediately notified the var-ious Cabinet Ministers and called a Cabinet meeting to arrange to bring the

body home.

The sad news spread very rapidly

and the Premier and Cabinet Ministers were besieged with inquiries.

Consternation and Sorrow.

Montreal, Dec. 26.—The news to the effect that Hon. Mr. Prefontaine had died suddenly in Paris caused consternation amongst his many friends, both party carrys here as well as sternation amongst his many friends, in both party camps here, as well as deep sorrow. Raymond Prefontaine is perhaps the best-known man in Montreal, and, unlike other strong party men, had no personal enemies. From alderman to mayor he had worked up a strong following and when he entered the Federal Cabinet his municipal friends investigated. pal friends, irrespective of party name, were then his adherents. While no other Liberal could poll a big majority in Malsonneauve, the Minister of Marine could always count on two thou sand majority at least, the English

The day after the late Minister was sworn in he told your correspondent that it would be his policy to sink all party feeling when dealing with his department, and all will agree that he left his record.
