By uniting the three districts, most if not all, that is at present unatisfac tory could be remedied. A larger and better farm could be purchased, bett3r and more suitabls buildings erected, provision evald be made for the larmless insane paupers, thus saring tae
County a larye sum annually. Trades conid be taight and a school could be tept in connection with the poor farm, 3) the paupar children could be taught, to become usfal members of seciety and not as in the past tarned eut to reproduce their kind to become in tara inmatas of the poor house, thus extail ing oa the town or county a race of
hereditary paupers if not crimianals.
