It has passed out with the strike all over, but with a certain amount of distress, resulting from the strike, prevailing in the city and district. Vigorous and active efforts are being taken to cope with this distress and it is hoped that it will all disappear early in the New Year. Altogether 1914 has been better than its mine has steadily improved every wonth, and the outlook is still brighter for 1915. The effects of the improvement may not be felt immediately. There are many reasons to account for this. There has been a big slump in the lumbering business, and small auxiliary industries have also fallen on hard times. The coal market also has yet to recover from the disarrangement and dislocation caused by the long troubles on the island.
