ASKS FOR ARREST
OF COL. MACHIN

Choquette, Quebec Barrister, also Asks Arrest of Valcartier Commandant.

Quebec, Aug. 29.—Asking that Lieut.-Colonel Machin, Director of Military Service, be arrested for contempt of court and held until he speaks and gives out figures concerning the number of draftees enlisted so far under the Military Service Act, and demanding also that Col. Rogers, commandant at Valcartier, be arrested for contempt of court.

F. Choquette, son of Senator Choquette and counsel for a number of draftees who obtained writs of habeas corpus, sprang a tingling situation in the practice court here today before Mr. Justice Drouin.

Col. Rogers repeatedly has been ordered to appear in connection with habeas corpus cases, but he has never appeared, hence the motion.

Mr. Choquette's request was officially submitted to the court today, following the refusal yesterday of Lieut.-Col. Machin to answer the questions asked him in court when he appeared in proceedings here.

A motion also was introduced to force General Ashton, of Ottawa, to reimburse the \$25 he had received for transportation since he did not appear in court as requested.

Mr. Justice Drouin has taken the motions under consideration.

WELSH WORKING-MAN
BECOMES BRIG-GEN.

London, Aug. 28.—Godfrey Jones of Wales, is the first working man in the United Kingdom to attain the rank of general. He enlisted in the ranks and during the war was steadily promoted until he was named colonel a short time ago. Now he has been nominated a brigadier-general.

TWELVE KILLED IN MINE

Tacoma, Wash., Aug. 29.—Twelve men were killed and four injured in the explosion of the Pacific Coast Coal Company's mine at Barnett yesterday afternoon. It was definitely ascertained early this morning. There were 180 men in the mine at the time of the explosion.

With a view to studying the possibilities of developing the tourist traffic on the west coast of Vancouver Island next year, Mr. W. H. Brodie, general passenger agent of the C.P.R., made a trip by the steamer Princess Maquinna last week. He is much impressed with opportunities in that section of the province for building up a large tourist trade and it is not unlikely that the C.P.R. will make a move in that direction next spring.

J. J. Murphy, aged 77, of 1342 Sixth avenue west, Vancouver, was fatally injured by being struck by an auto truck, B.C. 14,995, driven by Norman Smith, 539 Burrard St., at the corner of Sixth avenue and Granville street, Vancouver, Tuesday afternoon. He died at the Vancouver General Hospital an hour later.

U.S. TREASURY OFFICIAL

Washington, Aug. 29.—Albert Rathbone, of New York, was nominated today by President Wilson to be Assistant Secretary of the Treasury to succeed Oscar T. Crosby, who is representing the Treasury in France.

The provincial police have not as yet received all the particulars of the loss of Dan Gillis off the launch Neptune when passing Point Atkinson Wednesday night. Gillis disappeared and no doubt was drowned. A splash was heard and as he was missing the launch searched the vicinity without finding him.
