TERRIFIC EXPLOSION

IN PIT.

Seven Men Killed and Four Terribly Injured on Transcontinental.

NEWYEN, Ont., Thursday.—Later details of the accident which occurred on Tuesday night, resulting from the premature explosion of a large quantity of dynamite in a narrow pit on D. McLean's sub-contract on the line of the Transcontinental Railway, eighteen miles north of here state that in addition to the seven men who were killed, four were terribly injured.

Not a man of the eleven who were working in the rock cutting escaped injury. So far only three of the bodies of the seven that were killed have been extricated from under the mass of rock under which they are buried. The names of the killed have not yet been ascertained, but all of the men were Italians. A rigid investigation is to be held.

TO THE PEOPLE OF INDIA.

LONDON, Eng., Thursday.—On the occasion of the fiftieth anniversary of Great Britain's control of the direct government of India, Queen Victoria, having been proclaimed empress throughout India on November 1, 1858, King Edward yesterday issued a long message to the Princes and peoples of India, which the Viceroy, the Earl of Minto, read at the durbar at Jodhpur today.

The message dwells upon the peaceful progress of the empire under a beneficent administration, pays warm tribute to the loyalty of the Indian subjects, and troops and announces amnesty for prisoners, and a further gradual extension of the equality in citizenship, and a greater share by the Indians in legislation and government.

SENTENCED TO DEATH

WATERTOWN, N. Y., Tuesday.—J. Farmer, who was convicted of murder in the first degree in having killed Sarah Brennan on April 23, was taken to Auburn prison today under sentence of death during the week beginning December 21. An appeal will be taken.

W. H. FAFT FOR PRESIDENT.

Republican Candidate Carries United States By Reduced Majority.

BRYAN DEFEATED

By Party That Stole His Principles and Paraded Them As Their Own.

NEW YORK, Wednesday.—Practically complete returns received up to a late hour tonight indicate that William H. Taft of Ohio as president-elect will have a vote of 309 in the electoral college.

This is within sixteen votes of the forecast by National Chairman Frank H. Hitchcock and 67 more than a majority out of the total electoral vote of 483.

The most important news of the late returns indicate that Maryland, after vacillating during the day and apparently being safe for democracy, has been swung into the Taft column. The unofficial figures give Mr. Taft the state by 149 votes.

Maryland was the last of the doubtful states to be heard from. Indiana and West Virginia, as well as Montana, turned out to be safely Republican. Colorado went for Bryan.

Mr. Bryan has a total of 174 votes, two less than he received in 1896. In 1904 Mr. Bryan received only 140 votes, and in 1896 the Nebraskan received 176 votes.

ANDERSON FURNITURE CO. WILLING TO START FACTORY

Ask Guarantee of \$40,000 Bonds From City on \$100,000 Plant To Employ 75 Hands.

HALIFAX, N. S., Wednesday.—Proposals for the establishment of a chair factory in Halifax which will employ seventy-five men, to start were laid before the city council last night. For some time the board of trade have been investigating this industry, and also the business of Oliver Anderson, formerly of Newcastle, N. B. They found both satisfactory.

The promoters ask that the city guarantee bonds to the extent of \$40,000. A plant to cost \$100,000 is to be erected and the city will be given a first mortgage on this for security. The matter was referred to a committee to report in a week.

ANNUAL SURVEY OF ST. LAWRENCE CHANNEL.

MONTREAL, Que., Thursday.—The annual survey of the St. Lawrence channel between Montreal and Crane Island, began today. Hon. Mr. Brodeur, minister of marine and fisheries is in charge.

Others who left on the tour include prominent Canadian shipping men, members of the Montreal harbor board, and members of the board of trade.

RIOTS IN BERLIN.

Ten Thousand Socialists Dispersed by the Police.

BERLIN, Wednesday.—A mass meeting of Social Democrats, held last night to protest against the treatment of the Socialists minority in the Prussian Diet resulted in numerous conflicts with the police who forcibly dispersed ten thousand Socialists who had been unable to gain admission to the meeting. A large number of arrests were made, and, fearing that the crowds would march on the castle, the police cut off the streets and bridges leading to it.

LIFTING A RIVER OVER MOUNTAIN.

Wonderful Engineering Feat Accomplished in British Columbia Gold Fields.

VANCOUVER, B. C., Monday.—The work of lifting a river of water seventy miles over mountains and turning it against the golden gravels of the heart of the Klondike has been completed by the Yukon Gold Company. The tremendous labor involved has required three years of persistent activity, and a corps of thousands of men, headed and directed by skillful engineers. The mammoth conduit is ready for the water, but the stream will not be turned on until next spring it is stated. It is probable also that much of next season will be required to get the ditch into first class shape but the gravel will be sent spinning before the year has gone. The new undertaking should mean much for the history of the Yukon.

A. N. C. Treadgold, promoter of the Yukon Gold Company, and organizer of the properties, who has just left Dawson after a hurried visit, spoke very highly while in the northern city of the good work done by the operative force in the construction of the ditch and the installation of the pipe line.

"I deem the work done by the men here," says Mr. Treadgold, "one of the greatest accomplishments of the kind in the history of the world; in fact, considering that this enterprise has been carried out in the sub-Arctic it may be declared the greatest undertaking of the kind in history. The managers here on the ground deserve great credit. I should say that it is a triumph of young manhood. Old men never would have accomplished it. The work is a splendid example of what pluck, hustle and energy can accomplish. In two or three years more the entire equipment will be operating at its best, and the splendid results will be apparent."

The men engaged by the Yukon Gold Company this year have numbered approximately two thousand, of whom two-thirds have been on the pipe line work. O. B. Perry, the general manager, has been in the field even since the opening of navigation, while C. A. Thomas, the local manager, has not left the field once, summer or winter, since the vast enterprise was undertaken three years ago. Both are young men, both on the sunny side of thirty-five. At present the large force of men who have been at work along the pipe line during the summer, are pouring into Dawson as fast as the camps at the various points are closed.

Angus Macdonald the chief field man of the pipe line, is squaring up his work of the general construction, and is having the camps closed as fast as the work at each place is finished. In his opinion the work has been far more difficult than if it had been undertaken in the tropics or at the Isthmus of Panama, and in this opinion there are many others who agree with him.

This autumn sees the completion of the work from Tombstone to Lovett and Cripple Creek. The pipe line is intended to convey 5,000 inches of water, but it is said to have a capacity when crowded, to 7,000 inches.
