Christians, the number of native Catholic priests in India, The 232 shown in the table are only those of the mission directly under the Propaganda. To these must be added the native priests in the diocese under the Archbishop of Goa, of whom there are 782, and the 387 priests of the churches of Syrian rite in full communion with Rome in the vicariates of Trichur and Kottayam. The total number is therefore 1400.

So that there are now 1400 priests in India and Ceylon who are natives of the country, a fact that speaks eloquently for the development of the Catholic mission.
