

LOCAL AND OTHER ITEMS

The Renter Telegram Company reports to London that a tidal wave and earthquake destroyed 1,500 lives in Simais, off Sumatra.

Mr. G. A. Sharp, Superintendent of the P. E. Island Railway, returned from Ottawa on Saturday last and continues the business of Superintendent at the old stand.

There was a good attendance at the market yesterday. Prices were not much changed from those of last market day. There was a large quantity of hay which sold mostly for fifty cents a hundred.

C. W. Gaul, Conservator, was elected on the 25th in the bye-election for St. Antonio's Division Montreal, to fill the vacancy in the Quebec Legislature caused by the death of A. L. Carter.

On the prairie in Southern Manitoba, some days ago, a party of Gallicians left a train thinking they had no more than a mile to walk to their homes.

On the 22nd the Red Star line steamer Vandalia collided with and sank the Dundee steamer Northworth Castle, four miles east of the South Goodwin Headlight near Dover, England.

The trial of Collins for the murder of Maryann McAulay, father McAulay's housekeeper at New Ireland, N. B. in August last, was concluded on Thursday last at Hopewell Cape Albert County.

Mr. Ewing of Montreal who has returned from Kingston says that Governor Sweetnam has been basely misrepresented in the papers.

Two more earthquake shocks, the heaviest since the great disaster on the 14th, were felt at Kingston, Jamaica on the 22nd at 5 p. m.

There was an immense throng at the Burns Concert in the Opera House on Friday night. After all the seats had been filled and all the standing room occupied, the doors had to be closed.

The news from Winnipeg, Regina and other western centres is certainly distressing. Hizzards, traffic blockades, and fuel famine are the predominant notes.

Hon. A. G. Blair, ex-Minister of Railways of Canada, and one of the most prominent politicians in the country, died very suddenly at his home at Frederickton, N. B. on Friday evening last.

Twenty miners are known to be dead and scores of others were injured on the 24th, as the result of an explosion in the Primo mine of the Colorado Fuel and Iron Company.

A Sydney despatch of the 23rd says: Complaints bills of the United Bank of Prince Edward Island and Bank of Nova Scotia are in circulation in Cape Breton, and particularly in the Sydney.

It is announced from Ottawa on what purports to be ministerial authority that a general Dominion election need not be expected before eighteen months at least.

Recent advices reiterate the accounts of the cold and snow in the west. Unprecedented severity of winter, tremendous snowfalls and the crippling of the long overburdened railway system, have brought about a state of affairs that threaten a national calamity.

A Honolulu despatch of the 24th, says: The volcano of Mauna Loa on the Island of Hawaii, continues in a state of violent eruption.

The light from the flames ascending from the crater is so intense that it is possible to read the print at a distance of 13 miles. The flow of lava that followed the beginning of the eruption is now subsiding, but the other streams are more active.

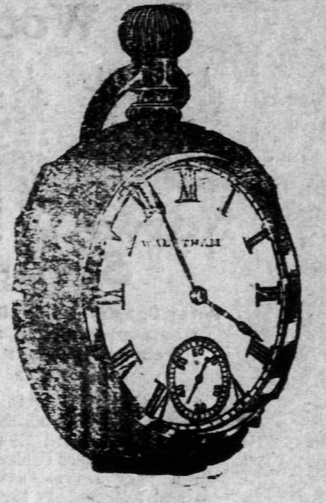

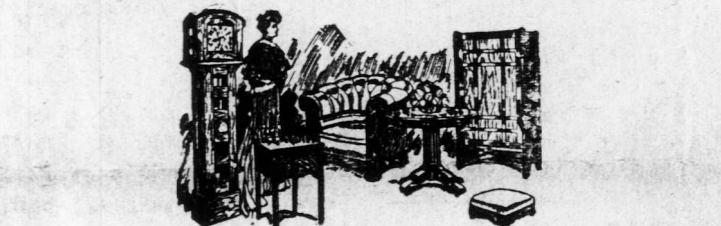
