To Fight Consumption.

According to the Daily News there was a special meeting of the committee of the Executive Council and a decision was made that the Government would fight more earnestly against Consumption. We are pleased to hear that a decision has been arrived at to do more to grapple with this dread disease. Legislation is fore-shadowed for the next session. The only indication of the lines on which the Government propose to act is that they will be moderate and such as are in vogue in Great Britain and the United States. We, however, do not expect the impossible, and it would be unfair to expect the Government to elaborate useful plans on the spur of the moment. We shall therefore await with expectancy useful plans, which will be calculated to deal seriously with problems of diseases, and among them tuberculosis stands out as the one which is sapping the vitality and economy of the homes of the people. As an assurance of good faith in the drafting and working out of any scheme, the Government will have to insure its perfect freedom from partisan politics. If it is tainted with the desire to distribute patronage to supporters or to find jobs for importunate hangers on, then it would be better for the Government to hand over the work to a non-Government body. The Government has before them the experience of the A.P.C., which has done excellent work within the limits of the financial and other support it has met with. We shall await the scheme and the bill with interest, and give it the support which it may intrinsically merit, and which the gravity of the situation demands.

A.P.C. Lecture.

Editor Evening Telegram.
Dear Sir.—On the last two Satur-
days enthusiastic meetings were held
at Bay Bulls and Witless Bay. At the
former place the school children,
numbering about one hundred, at-
tended, and at Witless Bay the meet-
ing was attended by the mothers. At
Bay Bulls Dr. Giovannetti gave a very
instructive lecture on tuberculosis,
under the auspices of the A. P. C.,
clothing his remarks in simple terms
suited to young minds. The children
were also addressed on the subject
of cleanliness by Mr. Molloy, R. C.
teacher of that place. At Witless Bay
the meeting was held on the following
Saturday, Dec. 2nd. Very Rev. Dean
Roche, P.P., occupied the chair. Dr.
G. then gave a very comprehensive
and able lecture of an hour's dura-
tion, during which he showed his au-
dience the many causes of consump-
tion and means of prevention, elu-
cidating his remarks with blackboard
drawings. The doctor closed his re-
marks by referring to the great work
done by Hon. John Harvey, and all
wish him a full measure of success.
Addresses bearing on the same sub-
ject were then delivered by Messrs.
P. Molloy and F. C. Walsh, teachers of
Bay Bulls and Witless Bay, respec-
tively, after which Rev. Dean Roche
(Chairman) and Rev. Fr. McCarthy
delivered short addresses, showing
their appreciation of the work being
done for the prevention of consump-
tion. Great satisfaction was expressed
by all.

from custody.

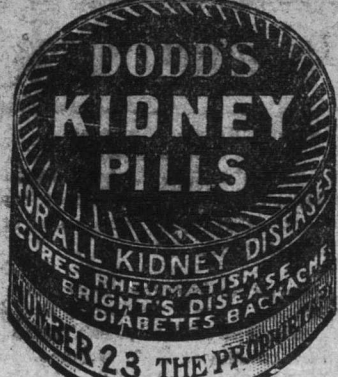
Police Court News.

Conviction Quashed.

Court Strongly Condemns Imposition
of Money Penalties in Case of
Grave Larcenies.

Yesterday the Supreme Court heard
the appeal of William Cripps against
a conviction at Grand Falls on a
charge of larceny, before Magistrate
Pitzgerald. This morning the Chief
Justice with the concurrence of Jus-
tices Emerson and Johnson quashed
the conviction. Mr. McNeely, appear-
ed for the appellant and Mr. Warren
K.C., for the Crown.

While quashing the Magistrate's
conviction of William Cripps on a
charge of larceny at Grand Falls, the
Court strongly condemned the evil
practice which appears to have
sprung up among Magistrates and
Justices of the Peace of imposing
money penalties in cases of this
character.
