Dying Judge Named Slayer.

WYTHEVILLE, Va., May 10.—"I'm dying. I'm dying. I'm dying."

Judge Massie's first words as he fell mortally wounded during the pistol fight that killed four others, in the Hillsville Court House, on March 14, were repeated yesterday at the trial of Floyd Allen, one of the gang charged with five murders.

Daniel Thomas, a sturdy countryman, who was first to reach the dying judge, detailed the scene and the fight. When he repeated Judge Massie's words his eyes filled with tears and he gave way to his emotions.

Sid Allen has never been captured.

The defence continued yesterday its plan of building up evidence to disprove the prosecution's charge, that the Allens had hatched a conspiracy to shoot up the Hillsville Court House and came prepared to do the work. It has been alleged that they even wore metal breast plates to protect them against the fire of the defenders.

Jack Allen, a kinsman of all the gang, denied on the stand that he had taken a steel breastplate from his brother Floyd before the detectives had arrested him. Jack Allen resented the sharp cross examination to which the prosecution forced him to submit.

Lives for the Mails.

"Every Post Office servant in England and America is doing honour to the memory of the postal sorters aboard the Titanic," says the Mail.

"Information received by the Postmaster-General at Washington, and at the General Post Office in London, shows that the men completely disregarded their own safety when the vessel struck, and began to carry the 200 sacks of registered mails to the decks below. As the vessel was sinking they appealed to the stewards to help them save the mails.

"There were four sorters in the Titanic. Two were Englishmen, Mr. E. D. Williamson and Mr. Jago Smith, both of Southampton. The other two were Americans. They continued their work to the last. All of them were lost is the information which has reached the American Postmaster-General."




