

Superannuation.
 To the Editor of the *Advertiser*.
 Sir,—I advise an article in last week's *Advertiser* from Mr. Ireland on the Superannuation Fund, where he makes use of the old and stereotyped Educational Department defence in favor of this compulsory and obnoxious clause, which defence is not worth a straw. The real issue is entirely forgotten. That the fund is unpopular we want no better proof than that out of 5165 teachers in Ontario only 131 subscribed to its support when it was voluntary. Why is this? It is because there are so many liberal restrictions placed upon the fund, so that it is not a pension, but a pauper fund. Before we can derive any benefit from it we must fall down on our knees and say that we are poor and afflicted, heart-broken and in distress, that we cannot dig, and to beg we are not ashamed. Whereas we should claim it as an unquestionable right, and as a reward for past services, and to an extent commensurate with the time spent in the profession. This is the manner in which all pensions are and should be granted. While such indignities and degradations as these continue, we as teachers are justified in opposing the payment of \$4 or 4 cents, the principle being the same, and in opposing the whole scheme.
