Elera Correspondence.
The thunder storm which passed over here early on Monday morning was very severe, and shook the buildings, both in the village and country surrounding, to their foundations. As soon as daylight appeared a number of small firearms were discharged to usher in the day in a right loyal manner. The forenoon was dull and cloudy, with light rain, but it rained all afternoon and evening, and the few persons who ventured in from the country went home in the afternoon rather disheartened. There were no games in the park at all, although some of the ticket holders went thither; and even the preparations that had been made to test the fire extinguishers were not completed. Small boys were seen clustered under the verandahs letting off squibs and fire-crackers, and getting "wet." The only amusement during the day was when our "town crier" went through the village informing the people that the prizes would be auctioned off in the drill shed in the evening. He was followed by about 60 juveniles who assisted very much in attracting attention. In the evening quite a large number of our villagers repaired to the drill shed for the evening's entertainment, which was a very successful affair, and was well patronized, the building being nearly full. After the entertainment the prizes were auctioned off, including Bologna sausages, wheelbarrow, beehive, etc.

The market on Tuesday was well attended, and a large quantity of good butter was sold at 16c per lb.
The roof is being put on the new English Church.

In the United States Senate a Bill was introduced directing the Secretary of War to cause a survey to be made of the Susquehanna River from Chesapeake Bay to the New York State line, and from that line through Seneca Lake to the New York Canal and to Lake Ontario, with a view to ascertaining the practicability of steamboat navigation between those points by dams, locks, and canals.
