TREATMENT OF ROUMANIA. Likely To Be Unaffected by Mr. Hay's Note.

Recent Outbreak in Cheng Tu Attributed to Prince Tuan.

London, Sept. 23.—"Nothing that will be of any permanent good can result from Secretary Hay's note to the powers on Roumania's treatment of Jews, unless somebody is willing to crush Roumania, and no power seems anxious to take on that task."

The foregoing quotation is the utterance of an experienced British official who represents the real opinion of the British foreign office on the subject of the negotiations between America and Europe.

Great Britain's backing up of the United States in the Roumanian matter has only produced evidence that the signatories of the Berlin Treaty absolutely refuse to take other than merely sentimental action towards alleviating the persecution of the Jews.

The exchange of views regarding the American note solicited by Great Britain has progressed sufficiently to convince the foreign office here that nothing material here is likely to result.

Joseph H. Choate, the United States ambassador to Great Britain, has broken up his holiday in Scotland and returned to London today. He is likely to spend the next few days in dealing with the Roumanian matter.

Advices from Pekin state that the mandarins have been informed from Cheng Tu, Scheuen, where the Boxer outbreak has assumed such proportions that the British principal chief of the Boxers, of Sien Si, and Lieut. Prince Tuan arrived at Cheng Tu just prior to the outbreak and fomented the insurrection.

A correspondent at Cheng Tu says the mere presence of this man arouses the Boxers to frenzied enthusiasm. New York, Sept. 24.—Bishop D. H. Moore, of the Methodist Episcopal Church, having supervision of China, Japan and Korea, says: "That China can ever be what it was before the outbreak is impossible. Her idols are shattered, her altars blasted, the sacred wall around Pekin has been dug down to admit the locomotive. The emperor has been shot through and through with western ideas, which, to the natives, seem to have an omnipotence all their own."
