THE EXECUTED AUSTRALIANS. London, April 5.-The war office yesterday afternoon issued an official statement of the facts in regard to the Australians sentenced for murdering Boer prisoners, as follows: "The Bushveldt Carbineers, who were recruited in South Africa, but included other colonials, were employed in July and August in the wildest part of the Transvaal, 80 miles northeast of Piet-

ersburg, and took a certain number of prisoners. Grave irregularities on the part of certain officers of the corps came to the knowledge of the military authorities in October, and an exhaustive investigation was ordered by Lord "As a result of the inquiry five officers were tried by court-martial at Pietersburg in January last, and were found guilty, as principals or accessories, of twelve murders. Lieuts. Hancock and Morant were sentenced to death, which was carried out. These

officers were also charged with the murder of Rev. C. Hesse. Although there was strong suspicion that they committed the murder, the evidence was not considered sufficient to justify their conviction. "Lieut.
