Many Members Press for Return to Old One of "Conservative."

**25,500 Get Free Passage
To Dominion.**

LONDON, March 6.—(Canadian Press Cable).—Replying to Sir Harry Brittain in the House of Commons today, Lieut.-Col. L. C. Amery, parliamentary secretary to the board of admiralty, stated that up to February last 1,300 persons had been granted free passage under the government settlement scheme.

These had been distributed as follows, he stated: Canada, 2,500; Australia, 27,000; New Zealand, 11,000; South Africa, 5,300; and elsewhere, 2,500.

the National Liberal and Conservative party at the meeting of members and supporters of that party held in the reading-room of the House of Commons this afternoon. The meeting, which lasted for over three hours, before adjournment until 10 o'clock tomorrow, was closed to the press, but a brief official statement was made at the close.

Briefly, this statement was that Meighen had been unanimously re-elected to the leadership; that the name of the party and the question of holding a national convention had been discussed, but that neither of the two latter questions had been settled at the adjournment.

All the provinces, including Saskatchewan and Alberta, were represented at the gathering. Members and senators, as well as many former members of the house and three or four lady delegates, were in attendance. Among the speakers were Right Hon. Arthur Meighen, Sir George Foster, Hon. R. J. Manion, J. E. Armstrong, ex-M.P., and others.

It is understood that a strong sentiment was voiced against retention of the present name of the party, and that a large section of those present were in favor of getting back to the old name of Conservative, or Liberal-Conservative party.

That, and the question of calling a national convention will be decided at the adjourned meeting tomorrow.

TASCHEREAU INTRODUCES BILL.

Quebec, March 7.—A measure of reciprocity between the Province of Quebec and Great Britain and Canada as regards the execution of judgments, is provided for in a bill which was presented by Premier Taschereau in the legislative assembly last night. The premier also brought in a bill to validate marriages or baptisms that may have been performed by clergymen acting without the sanction of the British North America act, which enacts that no person unless a British subject shall be authorized to keep a civil register.

FRENCH BONDS TAKEN UP.

PARIS, March 6.—The 6 per cent bond issue of the credit national, for reparations of devastated regions, which was opened for subscriptions during the month of February, exceeded 4,500,000,000 francs, it is announced today.

**SURE PARLEY TO
SAVE £30,000,000**

LONDON, March 6.—Austen Chamberlain, the government leader, today told the House of Commons that the cost of the British delegation to the Washington conference was not expected to exceed £50,000. He said the abandonment of the construction of four capital ships would mean a saving in 1922 of approximately £3,000,000, and that ultimately a saving of £30,000,000 would result from the Washington conference.

Total savings on estimates for 1922 and 1923 probably would exceed £10,000,000, he added.

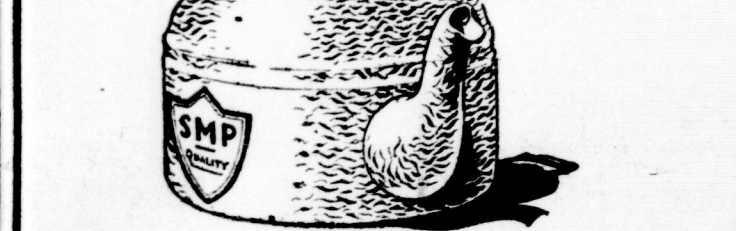

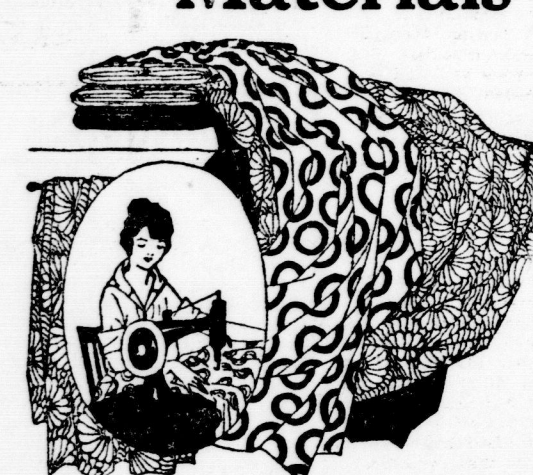
